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TO PROVIDE FOR THE SUPERVISION OF MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL OR MEDICAL WORK BY PERSONS OF ALIEN NATIONALITY.

1. This Law may be cited as the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law. Short title.

2. In this Law—

“recognized society” means a Christian society or organization which the Governor in Council may by Order declare to be a recognized society for the purposes of this Law.

Interpretation.

3. Every missionary or employee or member of a recognized society not in communion with the Church of Rome, the Orthodox Church, or other Oriental Churches, who is not a British subject, shall, before he shall commence or continue his work in Cyprus, transmit to the Administrative Secretary a document of guarantee in the form prescribed by the Conference of Missionary Societies in the United Kingdom or by the Foreign Missions Conference

Recognized societies not in communion with the Church of Rome, the Orthodox Church or other Oriental Churches.
