TO AMEND THE LAW AS TO DEALINGS BETWEEN TRADERS AND FARMERS.

Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Dealings between Merchants and Farmers Law.

Interpreta- 2. In this Law—
tion. “ farmer ” includes fruit grower and grazier.

Day-book. 3. Every merchant having dealings with a farmer shall keep a day-book as provided by Article 3 of the Commercial Law, which he shall produce before the Court when required to do so, and in addition to his debts and credits shall enter in such book full details of all bonds in customary form.

When 4. The day-book shall not be admitted as evidence in
evidence for favour of the merchant unless the provisions of Article 5
merchant. of the Commercial Code have been complied with.

For the purpose of that Article the Magistrate or Registrar of the District Court shall act as the officer appointed by the Commercial Court.

Quarterly 5. In the first fortnight after the completion of each
accounts. quarter the merchant shall furnish the farmer with a written copy of the account against him as standing in his books.
