SAINT BARNABAS SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND.

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A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE TRANSFER OF THE PROPERTY
AND ASSETS OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE ST. BARNABAS
SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND TO THE GOVERNOR.

Whereas Dame Louisa Storrs, by deed, made the 6th day of June, 1932, conveyed to trustees the property in St. Barnabas School for the Blind (hereinafter called "the Blind School") together with certain funds to be utilized for the furtherance of the objects of the Blind School;

And whereas the Director of Education by the same deed conveyed to the said trustees certain lands pertaining to the Blind School;

And whereas the buildings of the said Blind School and the Lands pertaining thereto were sold by the trustees by virtue of an Order made by the Supreme Court on the 5th day of July, 1934, and whereas new buildings were constructed elsewhere on Government Lands;

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And whereas during the year 1955, the Loan Commissioners acting under the Public Loans Law, loaned to the trustees the sum of £7,000 of public money to be used in the construction of new buildings for the Blind School;

And whereas the trust fund is now insufficient for the proper operation of the Blind School;

And whereas the Trustees desire to place the Blind School on a more permanent footing for the benefit of the Blind of the Colony;

And whereas it is the intention of the Governor to provide for blind children the facilities which the trust has
