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CHAPTER 177.

BAKERIES NIGHT WORK.

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A LAW TO REGULATE NIGHT WORK IN BAKERIES.

[16th January, 1950.]

Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Bakeries (Night Work) Law.

Interpreta-
tion. 2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires—
 “bakery” means any place in which bread, pastry or other flour confectionery is made or manufactured by way of trade or for purposes of gain;
 “Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Labour;
 “inspector” means an inspector of the Labour Department;
 “work incidental” in relation to the making or manufacture of bread, pastry or other flour confectionery includes slicing, wrapping, or otherwise preparing bread or flour confectionery for sale or distribution, but save as aforesaid does not include work in or incidental to distribution.

Prohibition
of night work
in bakeries
during cer-
tain hours. 3. Subject to the provisions of this Law, no person shall engage or shall employ any other person in the making or manufacture of bread, pastry or other flour confectionery or in any other work incidental thereto in any bakery between the hours of ten o'clock in the evening and five o'clock in the following morning, except on Mondays when the hour shall be four o'clock in the morning instead of five o'clock:
