ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS.

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A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR A SUMMER AFTERNOON RECESS
IN PLACES OF BUSINESS.

1. This Law may be cited as the Summer Afternoon Recess Law.

2. In this Law—

“ Commissioner ” means the Commissioner of Labour and includes any officer appointed by him for the purposes of the Law ;

“ place of business ” includes any place or premises in or upon which any trade, industry or business is carried on.

3. (1) The Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the Gazette (hereinafter called “ a closing order ”) direct that places of business shall be closed and kept closed—

(a) during such period between the fifteenth day of May and the thirtieth day of September in any year ; and

(b) on such days of the week ; and

(c) for such interval between the hours of twelve
