COMMUNICATION WITH VESSELS.

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Communication with Vessels Law.

Power to
make
Regulations.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Law, the Governor in Council may, with the sanction of the Secretary of State, from time to time, make Regulations for the better control in Cyprus of—

- (a) persons landing, or desirous of landing from any vessel, and
- (b) communication between vessels and the shore or any other vessel.

Every such Regulation when made shall be published in the Gazette:

Provided that until varied or revoked by any such Regulations the Regulations contained in the Schedule to this Law shall be in force.

Schedule.

Offences.

3. (1) Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or
- (b) aids or abets any person in acting in contravention of, or
- (c) knowingly harbours any person whom he knows or has reasonable ground for believing to have acted in contravention of,

any Regulation made under the provisions of this Law or of any order or direction given under and in accordance with any such Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to
