TO MAKE FURTHER PROVISION WITH RESPECT TO WIRELESS
TELEGRAPHY ON SHIPS.

Short title
and
construction.

1. This Law may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Law, and shall be construed as one with the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1916, so far as the same shall be applicable or shall be made applicable to Cyprus.

Interpreta-
tion.

2. In this Law—

“passenger steamer” means a steamer which carries more than twelve passengers;

“wireless telegraphy inspector” means an officer appointed by the Governor under the provisions of this Law.

3. The Governor may appoint officers as wireless telegraphy inspectors, who shall have the same duties and powers as if they had been appointed wireless telegraphy inspectors under the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914.

4. (1) Every seagoing British ship registered in Cyprus being a passenger steamer or a ship of sixteen hundred tons gross tonnage or upwards shall be provided with a wireless telegraph installation and shall maintain a wireless telegraph service which shall be at least sufficient to comply with the Rules made for the purpose under this Law,
