ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS.

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A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE MANAGEMENT, CONTROL AND
SUPERVISION OF CERTAIN AERODROMES AND FOR THE
SAFETY OF AIRCRAFT FLYING IN THE VICINITY THEREOF.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Aerodromes Law.

Interpreta-
tion.

2. In this Law unless the context otherwise requires—

“ aerodrome ” means any area of land or water
designed, equipped or set apart or commonly used for
affording facilities for the landing and departure of
aircraft;

“ aircraft ” includes all balloons (whether captive or
free), kites, gliders, airships and flying machines;

“ Director ” means the Director of Public Works;

“ Government aerodrome ” means an aerodrome
declared by the Governor by notice in the Gazette to be
a Government aerodrome for the purposes of this Law;

“ licensed aerodrome ” means an aerodrome licensed
under the Colonial Air Navigation Orders, 1949 to 1954;

“ livestock ” includes horses, cattle, mules, donkeys,
sheep, goats, pigs and dogs.

Application
of the Law.

3. This Law shall apply to all Government and licensed aerodromes.
