CHAPTER 325.

PLAYING CARDS (EXCISE).

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A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXCISE DUTY ON PLAYING CARDS MANUFACTURED IN CYPRUS.

Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Playing Cards Excise Law.

Imposition of excise duty. 2. An excise duty shall be paid in the manner hereinafter provided upon all playing cards manufactured in the Colony at two-thirds of the rate of customs import duty payable on playing cards of British Empire origin imported into the Colony.

Licence to manufacture playing cards. 3. (1) No person shall manufacture playing cards in the Colony unless he has obtained a licence from the Comptroller in such form as the Comptroller may prescribe.

(2) The fee to be paid for every licence shall be one pound.

(3) Every licence shall expire on the 31st day of December of each year, and shall be renewable annually:

Provided that the Comptroller may refuse to renew a licence if the licensee thereof has been convicted of any offence under this Law.

(4) Every licensee shall provide suitable accommodation within his factory for an officer appointed by the Comptroller, who shall at all times have free access to such factory.
