8. The Government of Cyprus will guarantee the estate of any infant or bankrupt or person, in respect of which estate any Official Trustee has been duly appointed, against any loss directly caused by the fraud of such Official Trustee.

Liability of  
and security  
to be given  
by Official  
Trustee.

9. Every Official Trustee shall have the same liabilities towards those interested in any estate in respect of which he is acting as he would have if he were not an Official Trustee. Every Official Trustee shall give such security to the Government of Cyprus for the faithful performance of his duties as the High Commissioner in Council may from time to time require and determine.

Rules of  
Court.

10. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner in Council with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice to make from time to time by Order in Council Rules of Court prescribing:—

- (a.) The fees which shall be chargeable by Official Trustees in carrying out any of the duties hereinbefore referred to.
- (b.) The regulation of any matters relating to the duties of Official Trustees in carrying out any of the duties hereinbefore referred to.
- (c.) Generally the regulation of any matters required for the purposes of more effectively carrying out the provisions of this Law.

TO REGULATE THE GATHERING OF OLIVES AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE  
BETTER PROTECTION OF CERTAIN CROPS.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Olives Law, 1899.

Commis-  
sioner to fix  
date for gath-  
ering of olive  
crop to begin.

2. Every District Commissioner shall in each year fix the date at which the gathering of the olive crop shall begin in each village within his district or in each group of villages united under the provisions of the Field Watchmen Law, 1896,<sup>(1)</sup> and shall cause public notice of every date so fixed to be posted on the door of every church and mosque in the village or group of villages, or, should there be no church or mosque, in some conspicuous place.

Penalty for  
gathering  
before date.

3. Except in the case provided for in the next following section, any person gathering olives before the date so fixed shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one pound.
