1. This Law may be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulations (Amendment) Law, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise Regulations Law, 1879, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Customs and Excise Regulations (Amendment) Law, 1924, and the Principal Law and the said Law and this Law may together be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulations Laws, 1879 to 1927. Short title.

2.—(1) The Principal Law, section 30 (2), is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “Chief Secretary” and the substitution therefor of the words “Chief Collector of Customs or any Officer of Customs or Excise empowered by him to act on his behalf.” Amendment of Law 24 of 1879, sec. 30 (2).

(2) The Principal Law, section 30 (4), is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “twelve months” and the substitution therefor of the words “three years.” Amendment of Law 24 of 1879, sec. 30 (4).
