TO PROVIDE FOR THE LIMITATION OF THE HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT IN CERTAIN CASES.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Hours of Employment Law, 1927. Short title.

2.—(1) The Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, make orders limiting the number of hours in which persons may be kept at work in any shop, factory or store or place of trade or business, whether wholesale or retail, to which this Law shall, by such order, be declared to be applicable. Power to make orders limiting hours of work.

(2) Every such order may be varied from time to time or revoked.

(3) Every such order and every variation or revocation thereof shall not become operative until it has been approved by resolution of the Legislative Council, and when so approved shall be published in the *Cyprus Gazette*.

3. An order under this Law may make provision for the hours of employment fixed by such order being extended on such occasions and for such purposes and to such extent only as may be specified in such order. Hours fixed by order may be extended.

4. If any person employed in any shop, factory or store or place of trade or business, in respect of which an order under this Law is in force, is kept at work for longer than the time fixed by such order, then the person or persons in whose name such shop, factory, store or place of trade or business is carried on, or in the event of there being no such person in the Colony then the person or persons actually in charge of such shop, factory, store or place of trade or business, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds. Fine for breach of order.

This Law was published in the Cyprus Gazette No. 1883 of the 16th November, 1927.
