

7. The Principal Law, section 21, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following sub-section, the first part thereof being numbered accordingly :—

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such Rules may—

(a) Prescribe the mode of taking the periodical census referred to in section 4 of this Law ;

(b) Provide for the imposition on offenders against any Rules made under this Law of penalties not exceeding one pound for each offence.

WHEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1929, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

Preamble.

BE it therefore enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, 1929.

Short title.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1929, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty-four Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.
