TO AMEND THE LAW WITH REGARD TO THE SALE OF
INTOXICATING LIQUOR BY RETAIL.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1930, and shall be read as one with the Licensing Law, 1889, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1926, and the Principal Law and the said Law and this Law may together be cited as the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1930.

Short title.

2. The Principal Law, section 1, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso:—

Provided that whenever the Principal Officer of Customs and Excise in the District of Larnaca shall authorise in writing the sale of intoxicating liquors on the premises of the Cyprus Pavilion at Larnaca (a) in quantities of not less than one bottle at a time, and (b) not for consumption on the said premises, such sale shall not be deemed to be a sale of intoxicating liquors by retail.
