TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCESSIONS. A.D. 1930.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Public Processions Law, 1930, and shall be read as one with the Public Processions Law, 1921, hereinafter called the principal Law, and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Public Processions Laws, 1921 to 1930. Short title.

2. The following section shall be added to the principal Law as section 6 :— Amendment of principal Law.

“6.—(1) The Governor in Council may from time to time by Order exempt from the operation of this Law any general or particular class of persons subject to any terms or conditions which such Order may impose. Power of Governor in Council to exempt certain classes from operation of this Law.

(2) Any person to whom any such Order shall apply who fails or neglects to comply with any such terms or conditions or otherwise contravenes the terms of any such Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to the penalties provided in section 4 hereof.

(3) The Governor in Council may vary or revoke any Order made hereunder, and any such Order or any variation or revocation thereof shall be published in the *Cyprus Gazette*.”

This Law was published in the Cyprus Gazette No. 2063 of the 10th June, 1930.
