A LAW TO AMEND THE TELEPHONE (AGREEMENT)

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Telephone (Agreement) Law, 1931, and shall be read as one with the Telephone (Agreement) Law, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Telephone (Agreement) Laws, 1930 and 1931.

Amendment
of principal
Law.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) Section 3. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (c):—

“(c) That the Government of the Colony will indemnify the Company against any loss incurred in the working of the telephone service during a period of ten years after the expiration of twelve months from the making of such agreement:

Provided that such loss shall be agreed annually between the Governor and the Company subject to the concurrence of the Secretary of State for the Colonies:

Provided also that the amount payable by the Government in respect of such loss shall be paid annually:

Provided also that the amounts so paid by the Government in respect of such loss shall not exceed the sum of one thousand pounds in any one year of such ten years or ten thousand pounds in all.”

(b) Section 4. The following words shall be inserted therein between the words “shall” and “allocate” (line two):—

“from time to time”.
