A LAW TO IMPOSE A TEMPORARY LEVY UPON THE
SALARIES OF CERTAIN PERSONS EMPLOYED BY
THE GOVERNMENT OF CYPRUS.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Levy on Salaries Law, 1932. Short title.

2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires— Inter-pretation.
“Government servant” means any person employed by the Government of Cyprus but shall not include any teacher:

“salary” means the salary attached to an office or post and includes any special addition to such salary granted personally to the holder for the time being of such office or post (known as personal allowance) and duty allowance and any other allowance attached to an office or post but shall not include any duty, travelling, subsistence or other allowance or remuneration to cover expenditure which a Government servant is liable to incur in connection with his official duties.

“teacher” means any male or female teacher appointed under the Elementary Education Laws, 1929 to 1932, or any Law amending or substituted for the same.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council by Order to impose a temporary levy at the rate and in the manner specified in such Order upon the salary of every Government servant and teacher and to exempt from such levy any class of Government servants or teachers who, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, would suffer undue hardship by the imposition of the levy. Power to impose a levy on salaries.

4. No deduction shall be made from the salary payable on leave granted prior to retirement to any Government servant or teacher who has been given notice of the abolition of his appointment before the commencement of this Law, or who may be given notice of such abolition at any time during the continuance of this Law. Exemption of retrenched Government servants or teachers when on leave.
