A LAW TO AMEND THE SHIPPING DUES LAW, 1917.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Shipping Dues (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Shipping Dues Law, 1917, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Shipping Dues Laws, 1917 and 1932. Short title.

2. The following section is hereby inserted immediately after section 12 of the Principal Law:—

New section 13 inserted in the Principal Law.

“Power of Governor in Council to exempt from payment of dues.

13. The Governor in Council may for special reasons exempt any ship from the payment of all or any dues under this Law.”

A LAW TO AMEND THE SEDITIONOUS PUBLICATIONS LAW, 1921.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Seditious Publications (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Seditious Publications Law, 1921, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”). Short title.

2. The following section is hereby inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 2:—

Insertion of new section in the Principal Law.

“Meaning of seditious intention.

2A. For the purposes of this Law a seditious intention is an intention—

(1) to bring into hatred or contempt or to excite disaffection against the person of His Majesty, His heirs or successors or the Government of the Colony as by law established, or

(2) to bring about a change in the sovereignty of the Colony, or

(3) to excite His Majesty’s subjects or inhabitants of the Colony to attempt to procure the alteration, otherwise than by lawful means, of any other matter in the Colony as by law established, or
