A LAW TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS
LAW, 1930.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Municipal Corporations Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporations Law, 1930, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”).

2. Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Law contained no bye-election shall be had and no notice under section 19 of the Principal Law shall be prepared, signed and published during the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and any vacancy occurring in a Council which, but for this Law, would have to be filled under the said section of the Principal Law, shall be filled in accordance with the provisions contained in the Schedule hereto.

3. Any person elected as a councillor under the provisions of this Law shall come into office upon his election and shall hold office for the duration of the Council.

4. Any person elected as a councillor under the provisions of this Law shall have the same powers and shall be liable to the same penalties as a councillor elected under the provisions of the Principal Law.

Powers and

5. If for any reason no election is held or made as in this Law provided the Governor may appoint any person duly qualified to be a councillor under the provisions of the Principal Law to fill any vacancy occurring in the Council among the Christian or Moslem Councillors respectively.

6. This Law shall expire on the thirty-first day of January, 1934.
