

Prisoners to whom Central Register shall relate.

(3) The Central Register shall relate to prisoners convicted of—

- (a) all offences triable on Information, and
- (b) such other offences, triable summarily, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.

Local Register.

9.—(1) There shall be kept by and under the management of every Local Commandant of Police in charge of a District a register, to be called and in this section referred to as “the Local Register”, in such form as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.

Contents thereof.

(2) The Local Register shall—
 (a) relate to prisoners convicted of such offences triable summarily, and
 (b) contain such particulars, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Commandant of Police.”

This Law came into operation on 21st July, 1933.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 and 1932, (hereinafter called the “Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 to 1933.
