BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Village Roads (Repeal) Law, 1934. Short title.

2. The Village Roads Laws, 1900 to 1933, are hereby repealed : Repeal and saving.

Provided that any sum which may have been deposited with the Commissioner of a District to the credit of any village under the provisions of the Laws hereby repealed and which remains unexpended at the date of the commencement of this Law shall be devoted by the Mukhtar of such village to such purposes of public utility in the village as the Commissioner of the District in which such village is situate may approve.

3. From and after the date of the commencement of this Law—

Discharge from liability, etc., under repealed Laws.

(a) any obligation or liability incurred by any person under the provisions of any of the Laws hereby repealed is hereby discharged ; and

(b) all proceedings under the provisions of any of the Laws hereby repealed are hereby stayed and all warrants issued thereunder are hereby cancelled ; and

(c) any person serving any term of imprisonment by virtue of a warrant issued by any Court under the provisions of any of the Laws hereby repealed shall be released from prison forthwith.

This Law came into operation on 12th March, 1934.
