BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1930, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1934.

2. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 25 of the following section:—

25A. Nothing in this Law shall apply to the sale of intoxicating liquor in an officers’ or non-commissioned officers’ mess of His Majesty’s troops or in a military canteen authorized by the Officer Commanding His Majesty’s troops in Cyprus.”

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Law, 1934. Short title.

2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires,—
