A LAW FURTHER TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO
TOBACCO.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Tobacco (Amendment) Law, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Tobacco Laws, 1932 to 1934, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Tobacco Laws, 1932 to 1935.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion at the end thereof of the following definition :
“ ‘ yellow-leaf tobacco ’ means any tobacco grown in Cyprus from seed of the Turkish or oriental type and commonly known in the tobacco trade by that name.”

3. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 3 of the following section :—

40 of 1932.“ Tobacco
seed.

3A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Law contained, any person may, without a licence, sow tobacco seed in a seed bed for the purpose of raising tobacco plants.

(2) Any tobacco plants raised in any seed bed as in sub-section (1) of this section provided shall be either planted out or destroyed before the 31st day of May in each year.”

4. Section 4 of the Principal Law is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) By the insertion at the end of sub-section (3) of the following proviso :—

“ Provided that the Director of Agriculture may, in his discretion, refuse to issue a licence to cultivate to any person who has been convicted of an offence under this Law or any amendment thereof.”

(b) By the deletion of sub-section (4).
