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A LAW TO AMEND THE WINES AND SPIRITS (SALE TO
SOLDIERS AND SAILORS) LAW, 1879.

BE it enacted :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Wines and Spirits (Sale to Soldiers and Sailors) (Amendment) Law, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Wines and Spirits (Sale to Soldiers and Sailors) Law, 1879, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Wines and Spirits (Sale to Soldiers and Sailors) Laws, 1879 and 1935.

2. Section 1 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor :—

“Restriction
upon the
supply of
spirits to
soldiers,
sailors and
airmen in
uniform.

1.—(1) No person shall supply any soldier, sailor or airman in uniform with any spirits without the permission in writing of the officer commanding His Majesty’s Military, Naval or Air Forces in the Colony, as the case may be.

(2) Any person who acts in contravention of sub-section (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding one month or to a fine not exceeding five pounds or to both.”

This Law came into operation on 12th July, 1935.
