BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Troödos Public Health (Amendment) Law, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Troödos Public Health Laws, 1920 and 1930, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Troödos Public Health Laws, 1920 to 1936.

2. Section 7 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following proviso:—

"Provided that the Board may, with the consent of the Governor, borrow temporarily from any bank at which any unexpended balance of the Troödos Public Health Fund is lodged or deposited, any sum not exceeding one hundred pounds."

3. Section 11 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

*Penalties
and disposal
of fines.

11.—(1) Any person contravening any of the provisions of this Law or any regulation made thereunder shall be guilty of an offence.
Penalty: imprisonment for one month or a fine of five pounds or both.

(2) In addition to any penalty which may be imposed for the contravention of any regulation relating to the construction or erection of any tent, hut, house or other building, any tent, hut, house or other building erected, constructed, reconstructed, added to or altered in contravention of any regulation made under this Law or of the terms of any permit issued by the Board shall be ordered by the Court trying the offence to be pulled down or demolished at the expense of the owner or occupier of such tent, hut, house or other building unless a permit in writing from the Board is obtained in respect thereof in the meantime:
