A LAW TO EMPOWER DIVISIONAL COURTS TO DELIVER
DEFERRED JUDGMENTS IN CERTAIN CASES.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Divisional Courts (Deferred Judgments) Law, 1936. Short title.

2. In this Law—

“action” includes all proceedings of a civil nature;

“Court” means a Divisional Court constituted under the provisions of the Cyprus Courts of Justice Orders and Laws, 1927 to (No. 2) 1935.

3.—(1) All actions which on or before the 31st day of December, 1935, were concluded before a Court except for judgment shall continue before the Court which tried them and such Court shall be and is hereby empowered to deliver judgment therein as if the Courts of Justice Law, 1935, had not been enacted.

Power to Court to deliver judgment in certain actions.

(2) In every action to which the provisions of subsection (1) apply judgment shall be delivered not later than the 31st day of December, 1936.

4. Every judgment delivered as in section 3 prescribed shall be deemed to be a judgment delivered as if the Courts of Justice Law, 1935, had not been enacted, and—

Right of appeal and powers of Supreme Court on appeal.

(a) any right which, if the said Law had not been enacted, any person had or might have to appeal therefrom to the Supreme Court;

(b) any power which, if the said Law had not been enacted, the Supreme Court had or might have to hear and determine any such appeal,

may be exercised in the same manner as if the Courts of Justice Law, 1935, had not been enacted.
