A LAW TO PREVENT THE UNAUTHORIZED USE OF UNIFORMS.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Unauthorized Uniforms Law, 1936. Short title.

2. In this Law—

the expression “ His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces ” includes reserve and auxiliary forces ;

the expression “ other uniform ” means any distinctive dress which indicates or is intended to indicate or may be taken to indicate that the person wearing it belongs to, or is a member of, any political association, institution, organization or party.

Interpreta-
tion.

3. Any person who—

(a) not being a person serving in His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces, wears or uses, without permission in writing from the Governor, any uniform authorized for use by His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces or any uniform so nearly resembling the same as to be likely to deceive ; or

(b) not being a person serving in the Cyprus Police Force, or other Department, wears or uses, without permission in writing from the Governor, any uniform authorized for use by the Cyprus Police Force or other Department or any uniform so nearly resembling the same as to be likely to deceive ; or

(c) wears or uses, without permission in writing from the Governor, any other uniform,

shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty : five pounds fine.

4. Any person who, not being a person serving in His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces or in the Cyprus Police Force, or other Department, wears the uniform of any of these Forces or Department, or any dress having the appearance or bearing any of the regimental or other
