A LAW TO AMEND THE LAW WITH REGARD TO
STAMP DUTIES.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Stamp (Amendment) Law, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Laws, 1923 to 1931, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Stamp Laws, 1923 to 1937.

2. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 22 of the following section:—

22A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this or in any other Law contained a bill of exchange which is presented for acceptance, or accepted or payable, outside Cyprus shall not be invalid by reason only that it is not stamped in accordance with this Law and any such bill of exchange which is unstamped or not properly stamped may be received in evidence on payment of the proper duty and penalties as provided by sections 18 and 20."
