A LAW TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 AND 1937,
AND TO VALIDATE CERTAIN EXPORT DUTIES OF
CUSTOMS LEVIED AND COLLECTED.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Law, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Customs Laws, 1936 and 1937, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1938.

2. Section 60 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“Export
duty on
carobs.

60.—(1) There shall be levied and collected upon the exportation of carobs an export duty of Customs at such rate not exceeding four piastres for each Aleppo Cantar as the Governor in Council may direct by Order to be published in the *Gazette*.

(2) For the purposes of this section ‘carobs’ shall include the meal, seed and gum of carobs.”

3. Any export duty of Customs levied and collected upon the exportation of any carobs or of any meal, seed or gum of carobs under the provisions of the section of the Principal Law repealed by this Law or of any Order in Council made thereunder shall be deemed to have been lawfully and validly levied and collected.
