## A LAW TO AMEND THE IMMIGRATION LAWS, 1936 AND 1937.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) Law, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Immigration Laws, 1936 and 1937, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Immigration Laws, 1936 to 1938.

2. Section 31 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

"Power to  
Governor in  
Council  
to make  
regulations.

31.—(1) The Governor in Council may make regulations, to be published in the *Gazette*, in respect of all or any of the following matters, that is to say,—

- (a) for prohibiting the entry of aliens into the Colony;
- (b) for placing restrictions and limitations upon the entry of aliens into the Colony;
- (c) for limiting the period during which aliens may remain in the Colony;
- (d) for controlling and regulating the immigration of aliens into the Colony;
- (e) for requiring aliens residing in the Colony to comply with such provisions as to registration, change of abode or travelling as may be made by the regulations;
- (f) for the appointment of officers to carry the regulations into effect and for conferring on such officers and on the Principal Immigration Officer such powers as may be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the regulations;
