A LAW TO AMEND THE TOBACCO LAWS, 1932 TO 1944.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Tobacco (Amendment) Law, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Tobacco Laws, 1932 to 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Tobacco Laws, 1932 to 1945.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the insertion after section 24 of the following section:—

"Factories not to be open except in presence of Excise Officers.

24A.—(1) No factory shall be open for the manufacture of tobacco or for any other purpose except in the presence of an Excise Officer appointed under the provisions of section 31 of this Law.

(2) Any person acting in contravention of sub-section (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on summary conviction, be liable to imprisonment not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine and any tobacco so manufactured shall be forfeited."

Insertion of new sections 24A and 31A in the principal Law.

(b) by the insertion after section 31 of the following section:—

"Days and hours of work.

31A.—(1) The days on which and the hours during which any Excise Officer appointed under section 31 of this Law shall work shall be the same as the days and hours of work for Customs Officers under the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1945, or any law amending or substituted for the same.

(2) Overtime work may be permitted by the Collector of Customs upon payment by the manufacturer concerned of overtime
