THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 10 OF 1946.

A LAW TO MAKE BETTER PROVISION FOR THE TAKING
OF CENSUS.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Census Law, 1946.

Short title.

2. In this Law:—

Interpreta-
tion.

“census” includes the collection of statistical
information respecting the property, production, trade,
employment, earnings, health, education or any
condition of the people.

“Census Officer” means any person appointed under
section 6 (a) of this Law.

“Superintendent” means the person appointed
by the Governor under section 5 of this Law to carry
out the taking of any census and includes any person
appointed to be an Assistant Superintendent.

Power to Governor in Council to direct taking of census.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Law, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council by Order from time to time to direct that a census shall be taken in Cyprus, or any part of Cyprus, and any Order under this section shall be published in the *Gazette* and it may prescribe—

- (a) the date on which or the period during which such census is to be taken;
- (b) the persons by whom and with respect to whom the returns for such census are to be made;
- (c) the particulars to be stated in the returns.

Regulations.

4. For the purpose of enabling any Order in Council directing a census to be taken to be carried into effect, the Governor may make regulations to be published in the *Gazette*—

- (a) providing for the division of Cyprus into areas for the purpose of any census;
- (b) providing with respect to the forms to be used for the taking of such census;
- (c) requiring the persons by whom and with respect to whom the returns are to be made to answer any particulars contained in the forms;
- (d) requiring information to be given to the Census Officers by persons by whom and with respect to whom the returns are to be made;
- (e) making provision for any other matters with respect to which it is necessary to make provision for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the Order in Council.

Appointment of Superintendent.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint any person to be Superintendent to carry out any census and to appoint such person as to the Governor shall seem desirable to be Assistant Superintendent.

Duty of Superintendent to carry out census.

6. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to make generally such arrangements and do all such things as are necessary for the taking of a census in accordance with the provisions of this Law and of any Order in Council or regulations made thereunder and in particular he shall—

- (a) appoint such persons to be Census Officers as may seem to him necessary for the taking of a census;
- (b) make arrangements for the preparation of the necessary forms; and
- (c) issue instructions for the distribution, completion and collection of the forms.

Appointment of Census Officers.

7. All Census Officers shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the Superintendent and the production of such appointment shall be sufficient proof of the
