A LAW TO AMEND THE TRADE UNIONS LAW, 1949.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Trade Unions (Amendment) Law, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Trade Unions Law, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Trade Unions Laws, 1949.

Amendment

2. Section 18 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following sub-section, the first part thereof being numbered as sub-section (1) :—

“(2) Any trade union operating without having applied for registration within the time stipulated by this Law, or operating after its registration has been refused, withdrawn, cancelled, or become void under section 10 of this Law, or after its certificate of exemption from registration has been declared cancelled, and any person taking any part in its management or organization, or acting or purporting to act on behalf of such union or as an officer thereof, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds, and to an additional fine of the like amount for each week during which the offence continues.”
