A LAW TO AMEND THE ELECTRICITY LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Electricity (Amendment)

Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Electricity Law (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Law ”).

section 7A.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 7, of the following new section :—

“Duration of
Order, etc.,
in certain
cases.

7A. Notwithstanding anything in this Law contained, every Order or permit granted under the provisions of this Law, or under any Regulations made thereunder, and which is expressed to have been granted for a period ending three years after the signing (not ratification) of a proposed treaty of peace between Great Britain and the countries at war with Great Britain at the time such Order or permit was granted or thereafter joining in such war, shall be terminated and shall be deemed to be of no effect after the expiration of a period of three years from the 1st day of January, 1954 ”.
