A LAW TO AMEND THE ALIENS AND IMMIGRATION LAW, 1952. 13 of 1952.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Aliens and Immigration (Amendment) Law, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Aliens and Immigration Law, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Aliens and Immigration Laws, 1952 and 1956. Short title.

2. The definition of “native of the Colony” contained in sub-section (1) of section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the words “any person who, not being recognized by any foreign State as having acquired its nationality on or since the 5th November, 1914—” (lines 1, 2 and 3) of the words “any person who has not, when in any foreign State and not under disability, by obtaining a certificate of naturalization or by any other voluntary or formal act, become naturalized therein on or since the fifth day of November, 1914, and who—”.
