A LAW TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and  
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as  
follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Criminal Procedure (Amend-  
ment) Law, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Criminal  
Procedure Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2. Section 138 of the principal Law (as amended by section 15  
of Law 6 of 1953) is hereby amended by the addition at the end  
thereof of the following new sub-section:—

"(3) If it appears to the Chief Registrar that any notice of  
appeal against a conviction, purporting to be on a ground of  
appeal which involves a question of law alone, does not show  
any substantial ground of appeal, the Chief Registrar may,  
instead of proceeding as in sub-section (1) of this section  
provided, refer the appeal to the Supreme Court for summary  
determination, and, where the case is so referred, the Supreme  
Court may, if they consider that the appeal is frivolous or  
vexatious, and can be determined without adjourning the same  
for a full hearing, dismiss the appeal summarily, without  
calling on any persons to attend the hearing or to appear for the  
Attorney-General thereon".
