- (b) every member of a District Court shall have power to make any order in any action not disposing of the action on its merits.”

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Accidents and Occupational Diseases (Notification) (Amendment) Law, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Accidents and Occupational Diseases (Notification) Law, 1953 (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Law ”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Accidents and Occupational Diseases (Notification) Laws, 1953 and 1957.
