

court that he did not know and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained who was driving or using the motor vehicle ; and

(b) any other person shall, if required as aforesaid, give any information which it is in his power to give and which may lead to the identification of the driver or of any person using the motor vehicle, and, if he fails to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Any person who is guilty of an offence against this section shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment."

A LAW TO AMEND THE EXCHANGE CONTROL LAWS, 1952 AND 1954

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Exchange Control (Amendment) Law, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Exchange Control Laws, 1952 and 1954 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law") and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Exchange Control Laws, 1952 to 1957.
