THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 4 OF 1958.

A LAW TO PROHIBIT THE ERECTION OF DWELLING HOUSES
IN AREAS OF CERTAIN VILLAGES IN THE PAPHOS DISTRICT
WHICH ARE BEING RESITED ON GEOLOGICAL AND ADMI-
NISTRATIVE GROUNDS.

Whereas the villages of Anadhiou, Malounda and Ma-
moundali in the Paphos District are being resited on geological
and administrative grounds and the owners of dwelling
houses in the aforesaid villages have each been given a free
grant of a site and a framework house by Government :

And whereas the public interest requires that provision
should be made prohibiting the building or re-building of
dwelling houses on the former sites of the aforesaid villages :

BE it, therefore, enacted by His Excellency the Governor
and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Building (Paphos Resited Villages) (Prohibition) Law, 1958. Short title.

2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.
“ building ” includes any structure or erection of what-
ever material and any part of a building so defined ;

“ Director ” means the Director of Lands and Surveys
and includes any officer appointed by the Director for all
or any of the purposes of this Law ;

“ dwelling house ” means a building intended to be
used or so adapted as to be used or to be capable of being
used for human habitation, or in respect of which there is
a reasonable presumption that some person has his lodging
therein ;

“ erecting ” and “ erect ”, respectively, in relation to
a building include altering, adding to, repairing or re-
erecting ;

“ resited village ” means the villages of Anadhiou,
Malounda and Mamoundali in the District of Paphos.
