ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 210 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by sub-section (1) of section 210 of the Municipal Corporations Law, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Municipal Elections (Closing of Licensed Premises) (Kythrea) Order, 1953.

2. In this Order—

“licensed premises” means any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquors by retail under the provisions of the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors Law.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors (Retailers Closing Hours) Orders, 1952 and 1953, all licensed premises, except clubs if intoxicating liquors are not sold therein, situated within the municipal limits of the village of Kythrea shall be closed and remain closed from 12 noon on the 30th day of May, 1953, until 12 noon on the 1st day of June, 1953.

THE WATER (DOMESTIC PURPOSES) VILLAGE SUPPLIES LAW.

CAP. 311 AND LAWS 28 OF 1951 AND 12 OF 1952.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 12 (4).

Whereas immovable property is required by the Water Commission of Yerakies, Nicosia District, in connection with a scheme for the supply and/or maintenance of a supply of water for the domestic purposes of the inhabitants of the said village;

And whereas the Commissioner of Nicosia in compliance with section 12 (2) of the Water (Domestic Purposes) Village Supplies Law, by notice published under Notification No. 62 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 11th February, 1953, and posted at a conspicuous place in the village concerned gave a description and particulars of the immovable property required as aforesaid (hereinafter referred to as “the immovable property”) and required any person claiming any right or interest therein to submit his claim with the necessary evidence in support thereof within the period therein set out;

And whereas the Commissioner of Nicosia at the expiration of the period set out in the aforesaid notice forwarded to the Governor a plan of the immovable property together with particulars as regards its owners, description and estimated value, together with two objections made against the proposed acquisition;
