THE IRRIGATION CHARGES REGULATIONS, 1931 TO 1953.

NOTIFICATION UNDER REGULATION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by regulations 2 of the Irrigation Charges Regulations, 1931 to 1951, I do hereby prescribe that the charges set out in the second column of the Schedule hereto shall be levied on and paid by any person making use of water from the water-works known as the Eastern Messaoria Irrigation Works, for the kind of crop specified in the first column of such Schedule.

2. The Notification published under No. 594 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 21st November, 1951, is hereby cancelled.

SCHEDULE.

<i>Kind of crop.</i>	<i>Charges.</i>
Wheat, barley or oats	4s. per donum for every watering.
Flax and other crops irrigated during spring	4s. per donum for every watering.
Sesame, broom or other crops, except cotton, irrigated during summer	4s. per donum for every watering.
Cotton	{ 5s. per donum for the first watering, and 4s. per donum for any subsequent watering.

No. 383. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.
CAP. 142.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Lefkara, Kato, in the District of Larnaca, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF LEFKARA, KATO,
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Lefkara, Kato, hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Lefkara, Kato) (Amendment) Rules, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Lefkara, Kato) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules") and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Lefkara, Kato) Rules, 1938 and 1953.

2. Rule 46 of the principal Rules is hereby repealed and the following rule substituted therefor:—

"Rule 46. The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say:—

(a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof ..	1	0
(b) For every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof ..	4	½
(c) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof	2	0

3. Rule 54 (1) of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion of the figure of 1s. in line 4 and the substitution therefor of the figure of 2s.
