ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2730

MADE UNDER SECTION 106.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 106 of the Customs Management Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of 8 of 1954 the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Management (Exportation of Wines) (Restriction) Order, 1954.
2. No person shall export or attempt to export to any Commonwealth country (as defined in section 2 of the Customs Tariff Law, 1954) any wine 64 of 1954. manufactured in the Colony except under a licence granted to him in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 3.—(1) The Director of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as “the Director”), may, subject to such terms and conditions as he may think fit, grant to any person, licence to export wine manufactured in the Colony to any such Commonwealth country, for sale therein, after previously obtaining the opinion of an Expert Committee composed of one person nominated by the Director, one person nominated by the Comptroller and one person nominated by the person applying for the exportation of wine, to the effect that the wine to be exported is sound, clean and fit for sale and consumption in British markets.
- (2) Any licence granted under this Order may be revoked at any time by the Director upon breach of, or failure to comply with, any of the terms or conditions of such licence to be observed or performed by the licensee.
4. Nothing in this Order contained shall apply to the exportation of wine, not exceeding four gallons at any one time, by any person who satisfies the Comptroller that such wine is intended for private consumption and not for sale.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2731

MADE UNDER SECTION 133.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 133 of the Customs Management Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the 8 of 1954 Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Management (Import Concessions for Educational, Scientific and Cultural Materials) Order, 1954.
2. The several goods and articles in the Schedule hereto shall, subject to the conditions therein laid down, be exempted from the payment of any import duty :

Provided that they are the products of a State which is party to the Agreement on the importation of educational, scientific and cultural materials approved by the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organizations during its fifth session in June, 1950, as ratified in accordance with Article XI of such Agreement,
