

No. 476. THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAW, 1954.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 232.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 232 of the Customs Management Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Management (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1955 and shall be read as one with the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 and 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 to 1955.

The Schedule to the principal Regulations, as amended by the Customs Management (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, is hereby further amended by the deletion therefrom of that part thereof from the beginning up to, but excluding, the part thereof under the heading "Conditions and Exemptions", and by the substitution therefor of the following :—

"CLASS I.—IMPORTED GOODS.

Division (A).—Deposited in any place other than a Customs Warehouse.

(1) For goods not packed in any receptacle, not otherwise specified in this Division, for every 100 okes or part thereof	5
(2) For every package containing wine, spirits or any other liquid whatsoever—

(3) For every package containing or consisting of machinery, motor vehicles, carriages, glass or earthenware, measuring—	
(a) not more than 80 cubic feet	10
(b) more than 80 cubic feet, for every 40 cubic feet or part thereof	5
(4) For every package containing, or consisting of any goods not otherwise specified in paragraphs (2), (3) and (5) of this Division—	
(a) not exceeding 25 okes gross weight	5
(b) exceeding 25 okes	10
(5) For acorns, box boards, coal, potatoes, and loose timber, tiles and bricks—	
For every four square yards or part thereof	5

(d) exceeding 30 gallons but not exceeding 60 gallons	135
(e) exceeding 60 gallons but not exceeding 100 gallons	200
(f) exceeding 100 gallons	300
