PROCLAMATION UNDER SECTION 189.

Whereas by sub-section (2) of section 189 of the Army Act of the United Kingdom, as continued in force by Act of Parliament for the time being, it is provided, *inter alia*, that where the Governor of a Colony in which any of Her Majesty's Forces are serving declares at any time that, by reason of the imminence of active service, it is necessary for the public service that the Forces in the Colony should be temporarily subject to the Army Act, as if they were on active service:

And whereas I am satisfied that, by reason of the imminence of active service, it is necessary for the public service that the Forces in the Colony should be temporarily subject to the Army Act, as if they were on active service:

And whereas Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies has given his consent to the making of a declaration as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, in exercise, of the powers vested in me by the said section 189 of the Army Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor, do hereby declare and proclaim that by reason of the imminence of active service it is necessary for the public service that Her Majesty's Forces in the Colony subject to the Army Act should be temporarily subject to the said Army Act as if they were on active service for a period of three months from the date hereof.
