THE ANTIQUITIES LAW (CAP. 43)—Section 12,
AND
THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW (CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 43 OF 1955).
COMPULSORY ACQUISITION ORDER.

Whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that in order to preserve the amenities of an ancient monument in the old town of Famagusta, that is to say the ruined church under item No. 19 of Famagusta District in the First Schedule to the Antiquities Law, it is desirable that no building should be erected in the proximity of the said ancient monument upon the plot of land described in the Schedule hereto ;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 12 of the Antiquities Law, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct and hereby directs that the property described in the Schedule hereto be acquired on payment of such amount by way of compensation as may be agreed upon between the Commissioner of Famagusta and the proprietors thereof and that in default of agreement within one month from the date hereof the amount of compensation be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition Law.
