NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to build residential quarters for members of the Cyprus Police Force at a number of places in the Island, the cost whereof is to be borne by the Government of Cyprus :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare the building of residential quarters for members of the Cyprus Police Force to be an undertaking of public utility and does hereby entrust the Director of Public Works with the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to Notification No. 154 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 1st March, 1956, notice is hereby given that the following lands are required by the Governor for the undertaking of the public utility mentioned therein :—

1. All the privately-owned lands situated within the town of Lefkoniko comprising two donums and three evleks or thereabouts and including plots Nos. 282, 297, and parts of plots Nos. 293, 294 and 295 of the Government Survey Plan No. XIV/60, more particularly defined as the area delineated in red on the Government Survey Plan dated the 24th January, 1956, and signed by the Director of Public Works.
2. Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said lands who objects to the acquisition is required within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and of the evidence thereof, and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.
3. The Governor is willing to treat for the acquisition of the said lands.
4. A plan showing the lands described above is available for inspection at my office.
