THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 4) 1956.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 34 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor under paragraph 34 (1) (b) of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 4) 1956, and delegated to me by Notification No. 807 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 22nd December, 1955, I, the Assistant Commissioner of Kyrenia, hereby prohibit the use of motor cycles and bicycles within the Municipal limits of Kyrenia between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 6 a.m. as from to-day the 10th March, 1956, and until further notice.
