

4. Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (3) thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

Amendment of Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations.

“(4) In any prosecution under paragraph (1) of this Regulation, the onus of proving that there was in existence, at the material time, a trade dispute with which the strike or lock-out, which is the subject-matter of the charge, could be connected, shall lie upon the accused :

Provided that a certificate under the hand of the Commissioner of Labour certifying that there was in existence a trade dispute, during any particular period, in relation to any particular trade, business or profession, may be produced by the accused and shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.”.

5. Regulation 62A of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

Revocation of Regulation 62A of the principal Regulations and substitution of new Regulation.

“Prohibition of swimming.

62A.—(1) The Commissioner of the District may, by Order, prohibit, within such area as may be specified in the Order, swimming of any kind.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation the expression ‘swimming’ shall include bathing, diving, submerging oneself and generally traversing the water on any object whatever, other than on a boat or vessel.”.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 6) 1956.

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Control of Trawlers) Order, 1956.

2. No trawler shall trawl within the area of the territorial waters of the Colony specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 090 degrees to the high seas from Cape ELEA and a line drawn 090 degrees to the high seas from Cape GRECO on Admiralty Chart No. 851 of 8th August, 1941.
