In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Kyrenia hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Kyrenia Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Kyrenia Municipal Bye-laws, 1939 to 1954 (hereinafter referred to as " the principal Bye-laws ") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Kyrenia Municipal Bye-laws, 1939 to 1956.

2. Bye-law 29 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 29. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the animal market—

	<i>Mils</i>
(a) For every ass, camel, horse, mule or ox	50
Provided that the young ones of the above named up to 12 months old, if running loose with their mothers, shall be admitted free of charge into the animal market.	
(b) For every goat or sheep	10
(c) For every kid or lamb under three months	5 "

3. Bye-law 33 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939, and Notification No. 210, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 14th June, 1946) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words " of not less than 20 paras and not more than 5*p.*" and the substitution therefor of the words " not exceeding 30 mils ".

4. Bye-law 37 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 37. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by any person selling flour in the Flour Market or elsewhere in the Municipal Market—

	<i>Mils</i>
(a) For every sack of less than 50 okes gross	5
(b) For every sack of 50 okes and over gross	10 "

5. Bye-law 44 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 470, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 22nd July, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 44. A fee of 10 mils per oke shall be paid to the Inspector by the person exposing for sale any carcass of a pig or fresh pork."

6. Paragraph (1) of Bye-law 49 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939, and

Notification No. 210, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 14th June, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(1) The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any goods, other than flour, fresh meat, fish, pork or perishable goods, brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market:—

	<i>Mils</i>
(i) when the value of such goods does not exceed 200 mils	10
(ii) when the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 400 mils	25
(iii) when the value of such goods exceeds 400 mils but does not exceed £1	35
(iv) when the value of such goods exceeds £1 but does not exceed £2	50
(v) when the value of such goods exceeds £2 a fee of 25 mils for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 50 mils.”	

7. Bye-law 57 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939, and Notification No. 210, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 14th June, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“57. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of perishable goods brought into or on sale in the market for perishable goods :—

	<i>Mils</i>
(i) when the value of such goods does not exceed 200 mils	10
(ii) when the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 400 mils	25
(iii) when the value of such goods exceeds 400 mils but does not exceed £1	35
(iv) when the value of such goods exceeds £1 but does not exceed £2	50
(v) when the value of such goods exceeds £2 a fee of 25 mils for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 50 mils.”	

8. Bye-law 75 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939, and Notification No. 210, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 14th June, 1946, Notification No. 571, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 7th November, 1951 and Notification No. 470, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 22nd July, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“75.—(1) The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in the slaughter-house :—

	<i>Mils</i>
(a) For every oke of the carcass of any ox or camel of any age	10
(b) For every goat or sheep of any age—	
(i) if not exceeding 6 okes in weight	100
(ii) if exceeding 6 okes in weight	150
(c) For every oke of the carcass of a pig of any age	2

(2) In this bye-law ‘weight’ means the weight of the carcass after it is skinned, cleaned and dressed.”

9. Bye-law 98 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 212, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 15th June, 1944) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“98.—(1) The following fees shall be paid to the treasurer in advance for the removal of buckets or receptacles containing night soil or urine, for each month :—

	<i>£ mils</i>
(a) For every bucket or receptacle of night soil	2.000
(b) For every additional bucket or receptacle	1.000
(c) For every bucket or receptacle of urine	0.600

(2) In this bye-law the term 'month' means a period commencing on the first day and ending the last day of each calendar month and includes any part thereof."

10. Bye-law 197 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 42, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 3rd March, 1939) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"197. The following fees shall be paid to the treasurer for exhibiting any notice or advertisement on any hoarding:—

(a) For a week or part thereof	0.100	0.150
(b) For a month	0.300	0.500
(c) For a year	2.000	3.500 "

11. Bye-law 200 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 470, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 22nd July, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"200. There shall be paid by every licensee of an hotel of the *de luxe* and first class a fee of 33 mils per night, of the second class a fee of 30 mils per night and of any other class a fee of 20 mils per night in respect of each person of over ten years of age staying or residing in such hotel."

12. Bye-law 216B of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 210, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 14th June, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"216B. Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the municipal corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of 3 mils for every 10 okes or part thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt:

Provided that—

- (a) the fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of 5 mils;
- (b) when such fee is not an exact multiple of 5 mils the nearest multiple of 5 mils whether higher or lower shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 10 mils."

13. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the Second Schedule (as set out in Notification No. 470, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 22nd July, 1954) and the substitution therefor of the following Schedule:—

" SECOND SCHEDULE.

(*Bye-law 179 (1) (b).*)

ENTERTAINMENT DUTY.

(1) On each ticket the total price of which does not exceed 50 mils	<i>Mils.</i> 5
(2) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 50 mils but does not exceed 100 mils	20
(3) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 150 mils	25
(4) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 150 mils but does not exceed 250 mils	35
(5) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 250 mils 5 mils shall be added to the aforementioned duty of 35 mils for every 50 mils or part thereof of excess price:	

Provided that the maximum duty for each ticket shall not exceed 75 mils."
