**THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.**

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 18th January, 1956, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 26th January, 1956, under Notification No. 58 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), the Governor had authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Liveras (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months :

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months as from the expiration of the Order :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1955), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorization for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 18th July, 1956, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Orders dated 3rd, 6th and 28th January, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of 5th and 10th January and 2nd February, 1956, under Notification Nos. 8, 14 and 73 respectively (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders") His Excellency the Governor had authorized the use for military purposes of the lands and properties set out in the Second Schedule to the Orders (hereinafter referred to as "the lands") subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months as from the dates thereof :
